A share class of La Française LUX - Euro Inflation (the "Fund"), a sub-fund of the UCITS La Française LUX (The "UCITS") The Fund is managed by La Française AM International, part of La Française group of companies

### OBJECTIVES AND INVESTMENT POLICY

The objective of the Fund is to outperform (net of fees) the Barclays Capital Euro Government Inflation-Linked Bond Index, over any given 3-year period. The Fund invests mainly in investment grade government bonds issued in the Furozone

Specifically, the Fund invests in fixed rate, floating rate or inflation-indexed debt securities and negotiable debt instruments that are issued or guaranteed by a Eurozone member state. At the time of investment, these securities are rated investment grade or judged equivalent by the investment manager; however, if they subsequently decline in quality, the Fund may continue to hold them.

The Fund may invest in, or be exposed to, the following investments up to the percentage of net assets indicated:

- corporate bonds issued in the Eurozone: 50%
- bonds issued in OECD countries outside the Eurozone: 10%
- below investment grade bonds: 10%
- other UCITS/UCIs: 10%

The Fund may invest in credit notes.

The Fund may hold cash and cash equivalents on an ancillary basis. These may include monetary UCIs or UCIs whose investments' overall weighted maturity or rate reset frequency does not exceed 12 months.

Non-EUR investments may be up to 10% of net assets and are hedged to EUR. The Fund's modified duration may vary from 0 to 10.

· an arbitrage strategy between fixed-rate and inflationlinked bonds

The investment manager uses a combination of various derivative-based

• a directional strategy aiming to optimise the performance of the portfolio based

· an interest rate curve strategy aiming to exploit the variations of the spreads

• a credit diversification strategy founded on the use of bonds issued by the private sector

The Fund may use derivatives as a substitute for direct investment, for hedging, for efficient portfolio management and to create leverage.

The Fund may also use repurchase and reverse repurchase agreements for efficient portfolio management and to create arbitrage positions designed to profit from changes in interest rate spreads.

You can buy and sell shares of the Fund daily.

Specifically, these strategies include:


on interest rate and inflation expectations

between long-term rates and short-term rates

All income generated by share Class I (C) EUR of the Fund is reinvested and included in the value of its shares.

Recommendation: This Fund may not be appropriate for investors who plan to withdraw their money within 3 years.

# RISK AND REWARD PROFILE



**Risk and Reward Profile:** The SRRI (Synthetic Risk and Reward Indicator) demonstrates where the Fund ranks in terms of its potential risk and return. The higher the Fund's position on this scale, the greater possible reward, but also the greater risk of losing money.

The risk category is 3, which reflects the risk of investing in "investment grade" debt instruments, mainly in the public sector.

We bring your attention to the fact that:

- Historical data used in calculating the SRRI may not be a reliable indication of the future risk profile of the Fund.
- The risk indicator shown above is not guaranteed and it may shift over time. The lowest category does not mean a risk free investment.

Risks materially relevant to the Fund which are not adequately captured in the indicator:

<u>Credit risk:</u> the Fund can invest in debt securities. There is a risk that the issuer may default. The likelihood of this happening will depend on the credit-worthiness of the issuer.

<u>Counterparty risk:</u> the Fund enters into contracts with various counterparties. If a counterparty does not fulfil its obligations to the Fund (e.g. not paying an agreed amount or not delivering securities as agreed) the Fund can suffer a loss.

Interest rate risk: an increase in interest rates may cause the value of fixed income securities held by the Fund to decline. Bonds prices and yield have an inverse relationship, when the price of a bond falls the yield rises.

Risk linked to the impact of management techniques: risk of increased losses owing to the use of financial futures instruments such as OTC financial agreements, and/or the temporary acquisition and transfer of securities, and/or futures contracts, and/or derivative instruments. This risk may lower the net asset value.

<u>Selection risk:</u> the Investment Manager's judgment about the attractiveness, value and potential appreciation of a particular company's security could be incorrect.


